Section I: Demonstrating Proficiency in English

All students must demonstrate proficiency in English.

1. Students must have completed all English-Language Arts (ELA) requirements for graduation, with an overall unweighted grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or above in those classes.
2. Students must have passed the California Assessment of Students Performance and Progress (CAASPP) in ELA (administered in grade eleven) at or above the “standard met” achievement level.
